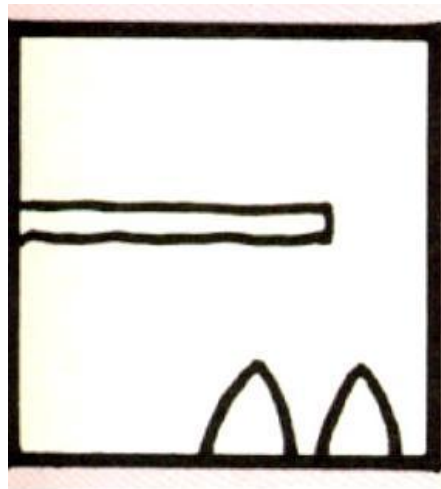


The Story — Chapter 12

Can you guess the double meaning of the Turvey below?



Here is the title right-side-up:

"4 2 9 5 9 5 8 6 10 4 10 7 10 3 10 7 8 6 10 1 8."

Here is the title upside-down:

"9 1 Y M 5 I C D I V 8 : 5 8 3 F 8 C 4 4 8 N F 9 3"

4 9 8 5 9 I N 4 6."
